


Grants by Partner Country

Academic Supervisor

Prospective applicants need to submit a confirmation of academic supervision ("Letter of Invitation"/LoI) from a full or associate professor at an Austrian ASEA-UNINET Member University* as part of their application.

To obtain this, candidates will independently need to:

- > find an institute or a department that suits their academic profile,
- > ask professors directly (they are used to such requests),
- > set up meeting(s) to discuss their project proposal (E-mail, Zoom, etc.),
- > upload the LoI in their application (on scholarships.at).

Lol Requirements

May be freely written (i.e., there is no template) and must contain all relevant information (e.g., planned duration of the research stay, proposed project title, which support the supervisor will provide).

Must also bear the institutional (i) <u>letterhead</u> and (ii) <u>stamp</u>, and (iii) <u>date</u> and (iv) <u>signature</u> of the prospective supervisor. Otherwise, ineligible for application!





Reference Letters

Prospective applicants need to submit two reference letters ("Letters of Recommendation"/LoR) as part of their application. The LoR:

- may not be issued by the Austrian prospective academic supervisor,
- > should be written by professors who know the applicant well in the context of their academic work (as relevant to the proposed project),
- must be uploaded by the candidate in the application (on <u>scholarships.at</u>).

LoR Requirements

May be freely written (i.e., there is no template) and must not be older than six months at the time of application.

Must also bear the institutional (i) <u>letterhead</u> and (ii) <u>stamp</u>, and (iii) <u>date</u> and (iv) <u>signature</u> of the reference. Otherwise, ineligible for application!





• **Translating Documents** If a document (e.g., copy of degree, language certificates, etc.) is neither in English nor in German, a rough (inofficial) translation may be submitted.

However, official translations may be required at a later stage by the prospective host university in Austria during the enrollment process.

• **University Enrollment** Candidates may apply for the Ernst Mach Grant – ASEA-UNINET prior to enrolling at a host university in Austria.

However, enrollment must be completed before receiving the scholarship.

• **Start of Project** Full PhD: Winter Semester (1st Oct.) is standard practice at Austrian universities. Postdocs/Music Practice: in accordance with supervisor (1st Oct. at the earliest)





Selection Procedure

The selection procedure is based on a multi-stage process.

- ➤ After 15th March 2023: Examination of the formal requirements (OeAD).
- ➤ May 2023: Assessment based on personal interviews conducted by ASEA-UNINET experts. Criteria include language skills, quality of the Research Proposal, and relevance of the project.
- ➤ Summer 2023: Final decision by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research (BMBWF)

What is an ASEA-UNINET project?

This refers to a research and/or a teaching cooperation between at least 1 **Austrian** and at least 1 **ASEAN / Pakistani** <u>ASEA-UNINET Member University</u>*. Several ASEA-UNINET Member Universities* from these member countries are welcome to participate in one project.

*Incl. ASEA-UNINET Candidate Members

What can be funded?

Above all the **transcontinental mobilities** of the scientists participating in the project are funded. These are the travel expenses (funded only for Scientists from Austria) to and/or the living expenses in the partner country (funded for Scientists from Austria AND from ASEAN member countries/Pakistan). Between one and around six mobilities may be funded as part of one project. One mobility may last between a few days and a maximum of 3 months.





When to / Who can Apply

The ASEA-UNINET Project Call takes place once a year (in the spring) and concerns projects that are to be carried out in the coming Austrian academic year (October to September of the following year)

The **ASEA-UNINET Project Call 2023-2024** (Implementation Period Sep. 2023 until Oct. 2024) **is open now until April 20, 2023**.

You are interested? Then do this:

- Find a suitable project partner at an Austrian ASEA-UNINET Member University. If you do not know one,
 please contact the <u>Coordinator of this Austrian ASEA-UNINET Member University</u>.
- Create a joint research or teaching project.
- Apply for the project. Attention: The application is to be submitted exclusively by the Austrian partner (usually the Austrian project leader).
- The approval process is multi-stage and takes several weeks/months.
- The Austrian partner will inform you if the project will be funded.
