Executive Summary

The WACE Global Challenge #7 is a 4-week, virtual, global student-industry project learning program. The program has engaged 50 students from 11 universities, across 7 countries in the 7th cohort, which ran in July 2023







Program Experience & inputs

The WACE Global Challenge is a 4-week, 50 hour, extracurricular, authentic student-industry project learning program delivered by WACE & Pratera, using the Practera experiential learning platform.

Program activities, outputs & outcomes by cohort

Program outcomes were positive, with indicators above benchmark / target with 85% student willingness to recommend. However, client willingness to recommend is 10% below target with 70% rate. Completion rates were 11% above target.

Program progression / attrition


Program completion rate of 82% was slightly above target. Most attrition occurred around commencement, which is normal.

Student Breakdown

Student skills development

Students engaged with a World Economic Forum 21st Century Skills framework – applying, providing and receiving feedback and reflecting on 6 key skill groups important for the future of work. Students selected specific skills for extra learning & development and rated their capability pre and post project. Students selected innovation (24%), problem solver (23%), collaboration & communication (23%) as the skills most sought to develop, and exhibited the most growth in service orientation (+16%), cultural consciousness (+13.6%), collaboration (+11.8%) & problem solving (11.6%).


